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Mrs. Chavez made a motion to approve the consent agenda consisting of payroll claims and accounts payable vouchers, approval of the minutes of the Regular School Board Meeting held on Thursday, September 9, 2021 at 6:30 p.m., approval of the minutes of the Special School Board Meeting held on Friday, October 1, 2021 at 7:30 a.m. and approval of the items listed on the Personnel Report waiving the readings and pending clear background searches; seconded by Mrs. Harlow. Motion carried 4-0.

B. Fund Report

Mrs. Smith said her financial report is provided in the board packet which includes the appropriation summary and the fund report and asked for questions from the board; no questions were heard.

6. BUSINESS

A. Approve Collective Bargaining Agreement - Dr. Schmidt

a. Public Comment

Dr. Schmidt noted that last year's collective bargaining process did not provide compensation increases. This year's proposal is for a two-year contract term with a reopener for compensation and a base salary of \$42,500. All teachers who receive an effective or highly effective evaluation rating will receive a \$3,200 salary increase and all teachers who have worked for 120 days or more in the prior school year will receive an additional increase based upon their years of service. Additionally, to meet the 45% requirement under state statue, the 3% TRF contributions will be moved into their base salary. Finally, there will be a one-time teacher retention stipend for teachers who continue employment until December of 2022. Additional language revisions include revisions for sick leave with provisions for a teacher absent for two or more consecutive days, added unpaid leave section, retained ancillary duty wages section and dates in health insurance that was not included previously. Mrs. Sgouros made a motion to approve the Collective Bargaining Agreement which was ratified and advertised as legally required, posted on the district's webpage and provided in the board packet; seconded by Mrs. Chavez. Motion carried 4-0.

B. Approve Administrative Compensation Increases and Contract Extensions - Dr. Schmidt

Dr. Schmidt said similar to our teachers, the building level administrators and directors had no compensation increases last year. Dr. Schmidt recommended administrative compensation increases and contract extension as provided in the board packet. Mrs. Harlow made a motion to approve administrative compensation increases and contract extensions as recommended by Dr. Schmidt; seconded by Mrs. Sgouros. Motion carried 4-0.

C. Approve Classified Salary Increases - Dr. Schmidt

Dr. Schmidt said classified staff did not receive salary increases last year. Dr. Schmidt suggested resetting some of the base salary rates of some classified positions to make our salaries more competitive with other positions in the community. Dr. Schmidt also suggested providing some compensation increases for classified staff as provided in the board packet. Mrs. Chavez made a motion to approve classified salary increases as recommended by Dr. Schmidt and as provided in board packet; seconded by Mrs. Harlow. Motion carried 4-0.

D. Approve Substitute Teacher Pay Rate Increases – Dr. Schmidt

Dr. Schmidt said beginning with the 2020-2021 school year, we have been using a floating substitute teacher position, which has proven to be a challenging role to fill. Dr. Schmidt said she is proposing a substitute teacher pay rate increase in an effort to address our substitute teacher shortage and to attract more substitute teachers. Dr. Schmidt recommended a substitute teacher pay rate increase from \$80.00 per day to \$90.00 per day for substitute teachers holding a valid Indiana teaching license and a pay rate increase from \$70.00 per day to \$80.00 per day for substitute teachers holding a valid Indiana substitute teaching permit effective as of October 11, 2021. Mrs. Sgouros made a motion to approve substitute teacher pay rate increases to \$80.00 per day for substitute teachers with a valid Indiana Substitute Teaching Permit and \$90.00 per day for substitute teachers with a valid Indiana teaching license as recommended by Dr. Schmidt; seconded by Mrs. Chavez. Motion carried 4-0.

E. Approve Fundraisers - Dr. Schmidt

Dr. Schmidt recommended approval of several fundraisers provided in the board packet. Mrs. Chavez made a motion to approve the fundraisers as recommended by Dr. Schmidt and as provided in the board packet; seconded by Mrs. Harlow. Motion carried. 4-0.

F. Accept Donations - Dr. Schmidt

Dr. Schmidt said our community continues to be extremely generous and recommended acceptance of the following generous donations recently received: Kiwanis Club of Valparaiso donated \$200.00 for the Builder's Club at BGMS; Optimist Club of Hammond, Indiana donated \$1,000.00 to assist the Life Skills Special Education Program at BGHS and Schweitzer Engineering Laboratories donated a corporate gift on behalf of their employee Jim Buff for BGHS students in the amount of \$100 to help inspire a lifelong love of learning in Math and Science. Mrs. Harlow made a motion to graciously accept the generous donations as presented by Dr. Schmidt; seconded by Mrs. Sgouros. Motion carried 4-0.

Mrs. Sgouros made a motion to accept the following Clubs/Organizations for the 2021-2022 School Year: Boone Grove High School Wolfpack Football Club; BGMS PTO and PTSC PTO as recommended by Dr. Schmidt and presented in the board packet; seconded by Mrs. Harlow. Motion carried 4-0.

H. Approval of Renewal of MOU for High School Based Dual Credit 2021-2022 with Ivy Tech - Dr. Schmidt

Dr. Schmidt said last year our students earned 1,119 dual credits from Ivy Teach. The dual credit courses offered were: Pre-Calculus, Trigonometry, Calculus, Chemistry, English 11, English 12, Government, History, Spanish 3, Spanish 4, Marketing and Management. BGHS is continuing to look to expand these courses as dual credits are free and these credits transfer to most Indiana accredited colleges. Dr. Schmidt recommended approval of renewal of a Memorandum of Understanding for High School Based Dual Credit 2021-2022 with Ivy Tech as presented in the board packet. Mrs. Harlow made a motion to approve the MOU for High School Based Dual Credits for the 2021-2022 school year; seconded by Mrs. Chavez. Motion carried 4-0.

I. Adoption of Resolution #1021-256 — Resolution to Transfer Amounts from Education Fund to the Operations Fund Recurring Basis: Monthly — Mrs. Smith

Mrs. Smith said this resolution allows the transfer of \$100,000 from the Education Fund to the Operations Fund each month and this amount will be less than 15% of the Education Fund Revenue which meets the State requirement. Mrs. Smith recommended adoption of Resolution #1021-256 – Resolution to transfer amounts from Education Fund to the Operations Fund on a reoccurring monthly basis. Mrs. Chavez made a motion to adopt Resolution #1021-256 – Resolution to transfer amounts from Education Fund to the Operations Fund on a reoccurring monthly basis; seconded by Mrs. Harlow. Motion carried 4-0.

J. Adoption of Resolution #1021-257 - Resolution to Adjust or Reduce Budgets - Mrs. Smith

Mrs. Smith said this resolution gives the superintendent the ability to approve appropriation decreases related to the budget years of 2021 and 2022. Mrs. Smith recommended adoption of Resolution #1021-257 as provided in the board packet. Mrs. Sgouros made a motion to adopt resolution #1021-257 to adjust or reduce budgets as presented by Mrs. Smith; seconded by Mrs. Harlow. Motion carried 4-0.

K. Adoption of the 2022 Budget #1021-258 – Gateway Budget Resolution, Appropriation and Tax Rates – Mrs. Smith

Mrs. Smith said as discussed at the October 1 special school board meeting, she recommends the approval of the 2022 budget with an overall tax rate of 1.1151. Mrs. Chavez made a motion to adopt the 2022 Budget #1021-258 – Gateway Budget Resolution, Appropriation and Tax Rates as presented by Mrs. Smith; seconded by Mrs. Harlow. Motion carried 4-0.

L. Adoption of Resolution #1021-259 Resolution to Adopt the 2022 Bus Replacement Fund – Mrs. Smith Mrs. Smith said as discussed at the October 1 special school board meeting, she recommends adoption of Resolution #1021-259 to adopt the 2022 Bus Replacement Fund as provided in the board packet. Mrs. Sgouros made a motion to adopt Resolution #1021-259 Resolution to adopt the 2022 Bus Replacement Fund as recommended by Mrs. Smith; seconded by Mrs. Chavez. Motion carried 4-0.
